

WHAT THINGS CAN HURT ME?

- 1. Livestock
- 2. Tractors/Equipment
- 3. Farm Chemicals
- 4.Roads/Railroads
- 5. Hay Bales



Livestock: Animals small and large can become dangerous. Cattle can knock down and trample a child without noticing that they are there. A calm animal can become dangerous if it or it's offspring feel threatened. Children should have adult supervision when around animals.

Tractors/Equipment: Large farm equipment can be loud and damaging to hearing if proper noise protection is not worn. Children should not be playing on or around equipment in any circumstance. Farm equipment is very large and loud, and drivers may not be able to see or hear children in the area. Children should play in a safe area away from any parked or moving equipment.

Farm Chemicals: Farm chemicals can be dangerous to children if they are not properly stored. Chemicals should be stored and locked away in a safe location away from children with original containers and labels.

Road/Railroad Safety: Children should never play on the road or on or near railroad tracks. Vehicles and trains are very large and heavy and move at high speeds and take a long time to slow down. There could be reduced visibility on windy days impeding the vision of the driver. Stay clear of these areas during play time and find a safer spot on the grass.

Hay Bales: Hay bales seem like a fun place to climb and play but they could impose serious danger. Hay bales are incredibly heavy and are usually stacked on top of each other. Should a hay bale fall it could result in serious damage. It is possible to fall between hay bales while playing, resulting in getting stuck in an area where no one can find you. Children should avoid playing on top of or near hay bales.
